

Pupil Premium.

The **Pupil Premium** gives publicly funded schools extra funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils from reception to year 11.

The criteria by which schools are funded is linked to a child or young person's eligibility for free school meals at any point in the previous 6 years. The level for the financial year 2019-20 is £1320.00 for primary aged pupils and £935 per pupil of secondary age. There is also funding of £1,900 per pupil who has been looked after for 1 day or more, has been adopted from care or has left care under a special guardianship order, a residence order or a child arrangements order.

At Oak View School:

- 26 pupils obtained Pupil Premium in this academic year.
- We are accountable for how we spend the funding and must have evidence in relation to its impact through the attainment of the pupils who attract the funding
- It should reduce the gap in attainment between disadvantaged pupils and their peers

The total Pupil Premium income for 2019/2020 was £39,755

Pupil Premium money at Oak View School is used predominately in the following ways:

- Access to school Family Engagement Officer for all pupils and their families.
- Support to access supplementary provisions.
- Purchase resources that enhance access to the specialized curriculum.

Impact:

The academic year 2019/2020 was cut short due to the Coronavirus Pandemic. This made it difficult to measure the impact of PP on our pupils. However, as in previous years, at Oak View School there is no gap in attainment between those pupils eligible for Pupil Premium and those not.

2020/2021

Pupils eligible and accessed Pupil Premium 33

Total Pupil Premium income for 2020/2021 will be approx. £50,458

The use of that money remains the same as for 2019/2020.
